Room 1

Last week Mrs Small was the Room 1 teacher for three days and she had a lovely time. On Friday the day was based around the story of Little Red Riding Hood. Here are some Little Red Riding Hoods and some Big Bad Wolves.

During our EOTC week many students painted rocks for our garden above the eating area. These are now in place and add spots of colour during these bleak winter days. The painted benches remain a work in progress but will further enhance the area when completed.

In Room 2 this week the focus has been on settling back into our learning routine after two short weeks. Story writing shows an increase in audience awareness by the descriptive language being used. In mathematics the students have been learning how to apply different strategies to solve multiplication and division problems. Recording the steps they take when problem solving has required a significant shift in mindset; although they may think they know an answer, it is within the working out that helps to identify any errors in calculations. Learning about the life of Suzanne Aubert and her accomplishments through various readings has been a highlight of the week. The students were impressed with her compassion and use of Rongoā (Māori medicine).
